AMENDMENT TO CONTRACT

Between the
Board of Administration
California Public Employees' Retirement System
and the
Board of Directors
Sonoma County Fire District



The Board of Administration, California Public Employees' Retirement System, hereinafter referred to as Board, and the governing body of the above public agency, hereinafter referred to as Public Agency, having entered into a contract effective October 1, 1990, and witnessed September 19, 1990, and as amended effective September 1, 1995, January 1, 2008, August 1, 2019, March 1, 2021, October 1, 2021, and January 1, 2023, which provides for participation of Public Agency in said System, Board and Public Agency hereby agree as follows:

- A. Paragraphs 1 through 20 are hereby stricken from said contract as executed effective January 1, 2023, and hereby replaced by the following paragraphs numbered 1 through 20 inclusive:
 - All words and terms used herein which are defined in the Public Employees' Retirement Law shall have the meaning as defined therein unless otherwise specifically provided. "Normal retirement age" shall mean age 55 for classic local miscellaneous members, age 62 for new local miscellaneous members, age 55 for classic local safety members, and age 57 for new local safety members.

- Public Agency shall participate in the Public Employees' Retirement System from and after October 1, 1990, making its employees as hereinafter provided, members of said System subject to all provisions of the Public Employees' Retirement Law except such as apply only on election of a contracting agency and are not provided for herein and to all amendments to said Law hereafter enacted except those, which by express provisions thereof, apply only on the election of a contracting agency.
- 3. Public Agency agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) and its trustees, agents and employees, the CalPERS Board of Administration, and the California Public Employees' Retirement Fund from any claims, demands, actions, losses, liabilities, damages, judgments, expenses and costs, including but not limited to interest, penalties and attorney fees that may arise as a result of any of the following:
 - (a) Public Agency's election to provide retirement benefits, provisions or formulas under this Contract that are different than the retirement benefits, provisions or formulas provided under the Public Agency's prior non-CalPERS retirement program.
 - (b) Any dispute, disagreement, claim, or proceeding (including without limitation arbitration, administrative hearing, or litigation) between Public Agency and its employees (or their representatives) which relates to Public Agency's election to amend this Contract to provide retirement benefits, provisions or formulas that are different than such employees' existing retirement benefits, provisions or formulas.
 - (c) Public Agency's agreement with a third party other than CalPERS to provide retirement benefits, provisions, or formulas that are different than the retirement benefits, provisions or formulas provided under this Contract and provided for under the California Public Employees' Retirement Law.
- 4. Employees of Public Agency in the following classes shall become members of said Retirement System except such in each such class as are excluded by law or this agreement:
 - a. Local Fire Fighters (herein referred to as local safety members);
 - b. Employees other than local safety members (herein referred to as local miscellaneous members).

5. In addition to the classes of employees excluded from membership by said Retirement Law, the following classes of employees shall not become members of said Retirement System:

a. ELECTED OFFICIALS: AND

b. POLICE OFFICERS.

- 6. This contract shall be a continuation of the contract of the Bennett Valley Fire Protection District and Rincon Valley Fire Protection District, hereinafter referred to as "Former Agency". The accumulated contributions, assets and liability for prior and current service under the Former Agency's contract shall be merged pursuant to Section 20508 of the Government Code. Such merger occurred April 4, 2019.
- 7. This contract shall be a continuation of the contract of the Russian River Fire Protection District, hereinafter referred to as "Former Agency". The accumulated contributions, assets and liability for prior and current service under the Former Agency's contract shall be merged pursuant to Section 20508 of the Government Code. Such merger occurred June 15, 2020.
- 8. This contract shall be a continuation of the contract of the Forestville Fire Protection District, hereinafter referred to as "Former Agency". The accumulated contributions, assets and liability for prior and current service under the Former Agency's contract shall be merged pursuant to Section 20508 of the Government Code. Such merger occurred July 1, 2021.
- 9. This contract shall be a continuation of the contract of the Bodega Bay Fire Protection District, hereinafter referred to as "Former Agency". The accumulated contributions, assets and liability for prior and current service under the Former Agency's contract shall be merged pursuant to Section 20508 of the Government Code. Such merger occurred July 1, 2022.
- 10. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a classic local miscellaneous member in employment before and not on or after January 1, 2008, shall be determined in accordance with Section 21353 of said Retirement Law (2% at age 60 Full).
- 11. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a classic local miscellaneous member in employment on or after January 1, 2008, shall be determined in accordance with Section 21354.5 of said Retirement Law (2.7% at age 55 Full).
- 12. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a new local miscellaneous member shall be determined in accordance with Section 7522.20 of said Retirement Law (2% at age 62 Full).

- 13. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a classic local safety member shall be determined in accordance with Section 21363.1 of said Retirement Law (3% at age 55 Full).
- 14. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a new local safety member shall be determined in accordance with Section 7522.25(d) of said Retirement Law (2.7% at age 57 Full).
- 15. Public Agency elected and elects to be subject to the following optional provisions:
 - a. Section 20042 (One-Year Final Compensation) for classic local safety members only.
 - b. Section 20938 (Limit Prior Service to Members Employed on Contract Date).
 - c. Section 20965 (Credit for Unused Sick Leave) for local safety members only.
 - d. Section 21574 (Fourth Level of 1959 Survivor Benefits).
 - e. Section 20434 ("Local Fire Fighter" shall include any officer or employee of a fire department employed to perform firefighting, fire prevention, fire training, hazardous materials, emergency medical services, or fire or arson investigation services as described in Government Code Section 20434).
- 16. Public Agency, in accordance with Government Code Section 20834, shall not be considered an "employer" for purposes of the Public Employees' Retirement Law. Contributions of the Public Agency shall be fixed and determined as provided in Government Code Section 20834, and such contributions hereafter made shall be held by the Board as provided in Government Code Section 20834.
- 17. Public Agency shall contribute to said Retirement System the contributions determined by actuarial valuations of prior and future service liability with respect to local miscellaneous members and local safety members of said Retirement System.
- 18. Public Agency shall also contribute to said Retirement System as follows:
 - a. Contributions required per covered member on account of the 1959 Survivor Benefits provided under Section 21574 of said Retirement Law. (Subject to annual change.) In addition, all assets and liabilities of Public Agency and its employees shall be pooled in a single account, based on term insurance rates, for survivors of all local miscellaneous members and local safety members.

- b. A reasonable amount, as fixed by the Board, payable in one installment within 60 days of date of contract to cover the costs of administering said System as it affects the employees of Public Agency, not including the costs of special valuations or of the periodic investigation and valuations required by law.
- c. A reasonable amount, as fixed by the Board, payable in one installment as the occasions arise, to cover the costs of special valuations on account of employees of Public Agency, and costs of the periodic investigation and valuations required by law.
- 19. Contributions required of Public Agency and its employees shall be subject to adjustment by Board on account of amendments to the Public Employees' Retirement Law, and on account of the experience under the Retirement System as determined by the periodic investigation and valuation required by said Retirement Law.
- 20. Contributions required of Public Agency and its employees shall be paid by Public Agency to the Retirement System within fifteen days after the end of the period to which said contributions refer or as may be prescribed by Board regulation. If more or less than the correct amount of contributions is paid for any period, proper adjustment shall be made in connection with subsequent remittances. Adjustments on account of errors in contributions required of any employee may be made by direct payments between the employee and the Board.

Recommendation:

Approve the updated EMS Billing Financial Hardship/Compassionate Care Policy

Financial Impact:

The expansion of eligibility outlined in this new policy is expected to increase the number of financial hardship applications. Staff estimates that this may result in a decrease in EMS billing revenue of less than \$10,000 per year.

Background:

The District Board of Directors adopted a Transport Billing Hardship policy in 2020. Since then, our EMS operations have expanded, and the policy has been updated and renamed to reflect current operations and ensure compliance with the requirements of the Sonoma County EOA-1 Ground Ambulance RFP. The changes are outlined below, with the proposed policy attached.

Sonoma County Fire District Emergency Medical Services FINANCIAL HARDSHIP/ COMPASSIONATE CARE POLICY

PURPOSE:

To establish a Sonoma County Fire District (SCFD) policy that allows the modifying of EMS charges based on current year Department of Health and Human Service Poverty guidelines.

SCOPE:

As authorized by Health and Safety Code sections 13917 and 13919, this policy pertains to all patients treated or transported by the Sonoma County Fire District.

Each patient may request one (1) hardship modification per consecutive twelve (12) month period.

SCFD is committed to non-discrimination. This policy applies to all patients without regard for the person's sex, race, color, religion, ancestry, national origin, disability, medical condition, genetic information, marital status, sexual orientation, citizenship, primary language, or immigration status.

PREFACE:

EMS charges may be waived, reduced, or a payment plan established, based upon financial hardship, as determined by SCFD. These procedures will ensure a just and fair evaluation of a hardship waiver request and will establish an audit trail for future use.

PROCEDURES:

- 1) No one will EVER be denied necessary medical transport service due to either their inability to pay or a lack of insurance.
- 2) Every effort will be made to collect from insurance for payment; after insurance makes payment, the District will attempt to collect remaining balance from patient.
- 3) SCFD will address cases of financial hardship on an individual basis.
- 4) Patients who are unable to pay their co-pays, deductibles, who are uninsured, unemployed, homeless, or for other reasons unable to make payments may request a financial hardship review of their EMS charges. Patients, or their designee, shall complete the SCFD "Financial Hardship/Compassionate Care Program Application Form". The form may be requested from Wittman Enterprises, LLC by calling (800) 906-6552, by mail to Wittman Enterprises, LLC P.O. BOX 269110, Sacramento, CA 95826, or downloaded from the SCFD Website: www.sonomacountyfd.org

- 5) The completed Financial Hardship/Compassionate Care Program application and supporting documentation shall be submitted to Wittman Enterprises.
- When complete, the Financial Hardship/Compassionate Care Program Application Form and supporting documents will be forwarded to the SCFD Board of Directors (or their appointed designee) to make a final decision. The Board of Directors (or their appointed designee) may waive all charges, reduce the charges, establish a payment plan, or deny the request. All final resolutions will be noted on the form.
- 7) SCFD will render a decision on the financial hardship/compassionate care request within 45 days of receipt of the complete application and supporting documentation. No collection activities will progress while an account is under review for hardship/compassionate care consideration.
- 8) If approved for modification, a copy of all documentation will be made and will be held in SCFD files for a period of five years. The original form will be transmitted to the billing company authorizing the modification or elimination of the patient's charges. SCFD will notify the patient in writing as to the final disposition of the Hardship Waiver.
- 9) SCFD will consider 200% of the current HHS Poverty Guidelines as a guideline in granting a hardship waiver.
- 10) After a final decision has been rendered on the hardship application, SCFD will gather patient demographic information from the patient care report and document this for tracking and reporting purposes. This information will not be considered while the hardship application is under review. The board of directors will receive an annual report that details the past year's hardship activities, including demographic trends.

Sonoma County Fire District Transport Billing Hardship Policy

PURPOSE:

To establish a policy that allows the modifying of ambulance transport fees based on current year Department of Health and Human Service Poverty guidelines.

SCOPE:

This policy pertains to all residents transported by the Sonoma County Fire District. Resident is defined as any person living within the Sonoma County Fire District boundaries (refer to Exhibit A).

Transported individual must **not** have been injured while involved in the commission of a felony criminal activity.

Each resident, as defined above, may request one (1) hardship modification per consecutive twelve (12) month period.

PREFACE:

The charges for EMS transport billing may be modified, based upon financial hardship, as determined by the Sonoma County Fire District. These procedures will ensure a just and fair evaluation of a hardship waiver request and will establish an audit trail for future use.

PROCEDURES:

- 1) No one will EVER be denied necessary medical transport service due to either their inability to pay or a lack of insurance.
- 2) Every effort will be made to collect from insurance for payment; after insurance makes payment, the District will attempt to collect remaining balance from patient.
- 3) Sonoma County Fire District will address cases of financial hardship on an individual basis.
- 4) Patients who are unable to pay their co-pays, deductibles, or who are uninsured, unemployed, homeless, or for other reasons unable to make payments may request a financial hardship review of their transport charge. Patients, or their designee, shall complete the "Request for Transport Fee Hardship Fee Modification Form" The form may be requested from Wittman Enterprises, LLC by calling (800) 772-6552 or by mail to Wittman Enterprises, LLC 11093 Sun Center Drive, Rancho Cordova, CA 95670.
- 5) This fee modification application will be forwarded to the client's appointed administrator or designee for review and decision. The Board of Directors (or their appointed designee) for the Sonoma County Fire District will make a final decision that will be noted on the form. The Board of Directors (or their appointed designee) may waive all charges, reduce the charges, establish a payment plan or deny the request. All final resolutions will be noted on the form.
- 6) If approved for modification a copy of all documentation will be made and it will be held in the fire department files for a period of five years. The original form will be transmitted to the billing company authorizing the elimination of the patient's charges. The Fire District will notify the patient in writing as to the final disposition of the Hardship Waiver.
- 7) The Sonoma County Fire District will consider 138% of the current HHS Poverty Guidelines as a guideline in granting a hardship waiver.





RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE SONOMA COUNTY FIRE DISTRICT, COUNTY OF SONOMA, STATE OF CALIFORNIA, APPROVING THE REQUEST OF THE RANCHO ADOBE FIRE PROTECTION DISTRICT TO PROVIDE MUTUAL AID ADVANCED LIFE SUPPORT IN CONJUNCTION WITH EMERGENCY GROUND AMBULANCE SERVICES.

The Board of Directors ("Board") of the Sonoma County Fire District ("SCFD") finds and resolves as follows:

WHEREAS, SCFD is an independent special district organized and operating pursuant to the California Fire Protection District Law of 1987 (Health and Safety Code section 13800 et seq.); and

WHEREAS, the Rancho Adobe Fire Protection District ("RAFPD") is an independent special district organized and operating pursuant to the California Fire Protection District Law of 1987 (Health and Safety Code section 13800 et seq.); and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 13862, SCFD and RAFPD have the power and authority to provide fire protection services, rescue services, emergency medical services ("EMS"), hazardous material emergency response services, ambulance services and any other services relating to the protection of lives and property; and

WHEREAS, since approximately 1999, Advanced Life Support in conjunction with emergency ground ambulance services have been provided in the northern portion of RAFPD as part of Sonoma County Exclusive Operating Area #1 ("EOA-1"), by a third-party emergency ground ambulance service provider contracted with the County of Sonoma ("County"); and

WHEREAS, on November 9, 2021, since the third-party ambulance provider contract was expiring in 2022, the County issued a Request for Proposal for emergency ground ambulance services and Advanced Life Support Services for EOA-1 (the "2021 EOA-1 RFP"); and

WHEREAS, on February 9, 2022, the California Emergency Medical Services Authority ("State EMSA") notified the County Director of the Department of Health Services ("DHS") and the Coastal Valleys EMS Agency ("CVEMSA") that critical care transport, basic life support, and interfacility transport ground ambulance services in EOA-1 were all "non-exclusive"; and

WHEREAS, SCFD has the rights, obligations, and authority over EMS, emergency ground ambulance services, and Advanced Life Support Services throughout the entirety of the SCFD territory and appurtenant ambulance service areas, pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 1797.201; and

WHEREAS, on February 17, 2022, the County and SCFD entered into a Settlement Agreement, which, in relevant part, authorizes SCFD "to provide emergency ground ambulance services in EOA-1 on backup, stand-by, and/or mutual aid basis"; and

WHEREAS, on February 18, 2022, the County rescinded the 2021 EOA-1 RFP; and

WHEREAS, on March 29, 2022, State EMSA sent a letter notifying DHS and CVEMSA that EOA-1 was no longer exclusive, because the cancellation of the 2021 EOA-1 RFP reverted County EMS Sub-Area #1 to a non-exclusive sub-area retroactive to June 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, starting in May 2022, SCFD, in conjunction with its subcontractor, Medic Ambulance Services, Inc., expanded its emergency ground ambulance services and Advanced Life Support Services into the now non-exclusive service area of County EMS Sub-Area #1; and

WHEREAS, on June 17, 2022, State EMSA sent another letter to DHS and CVEMSA, confirming that the exclusivity for County EMS Sub-Area #1 expired on June 30, 2020; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Government Code section 8617 and Health and Safety Code section 13863, SCFD and RAFPD have the authority to exercise mutual aid powers and enter into mutual aid agreements with other special districts; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 13877, SCFD and RAFPD may authorize the use of any vehicle, apparatus, or equipment outside the district, subject on any terms and conditions the districts' Boards may prescribe; and

WHEREAS, on January 18, 2023, the RAFPD Board adopted RAFPD Resolution R-5 23022/2023, in which the RAFPD Board found that the existing third-party emergency ground ambulance service provider for RAFPD has repeatedly failed to provide timely and sufficient Advanced Life Support in conjunction with emergency ground ambulance services to RAFPD, its residents, and visitors, in the now non-exclusive service area of County EMS Sub-Area #1, which threatens the health and safety of the residents and public in the affected territory; and

WHEREAS, in RAFPD Resolution R-5 2022/2023, the RAFPD Board further found that it is in the best interests of RAFPD, its residents and visitors, to immediately request that SCFD provide mutual aid Advanced Life Support in conjunction with emergency ground ambulance services within RAFPD territory in the now non-exclusive service area of County EMS Sub-Area #1;

WHEREAS, the SCFD Board believes it is within the SCFD authority and good public safety policy to support and approve the RAFPD request for SCFD to provide mutual aid Advanced Life Support in conjunction with emergency ground ambulance services within RAFPD territory in the now non-exclusive service area of County EMS Sub-Area #1.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Directors of the Sonoma County Fire District finds as follows:

1. That within the SCFD authority and good public safety policy to approve the RAFPD request for SCFD to provide mutual aid Advanced Life Support in conjunction with
