1. Existing Facility. Briefly describe what facilities you currently have or how service is currently provided.

The Sonoma County Fire District- Station 9 covers approximately 20 square miles and serves the populations of Guerneville, Rio Nido, Oddfellows Park, Vacation Beach, Guernewood Park and the Armstrong Valley. The District's Advanced Life Support Ambulance also serves the neighboring areas of Forestville, Monte Rio, Cazadero, Duncan's Mills and Jenner. Calls for emergency response services from this station exceed 1700 calls for service per year. The District currently has a Type 1 Fire Engine, a Type 3 Fire Engine, a Utility Vehicle, one primary ambulance and one reserve ambulance providing services from the station located in Guerneville, CA. The area has a history of federally declared disasters (floods and wildfires). Most recently the Walbridge wildfire in 2020 significantly threatened the communities within this service area.

2. **Proposed Facility.** Describe what you want to purchase or construct. Indicate what the facility will be used for, approximate size, and expected method of procurement. For buildings indicate location, basic materials or type of construction, and attach a sketch or working drawings. For items of major equipment, indicate new or used, existing or custom-built, and any special features.

The District respectfully requests funding to purchase ten(10) Portable Radios with accompanying accessories and twenty (20) Mobile Radios with accessories. This request would provide the opportunity to enhance the communication capabilities in the district. The new radios, if funded would provide for better reception and increased signal to transmit critical communications to our Dispatch Center and to partnering agencies who provide backup responses into our jurisdiction.

3. Need for the Facility. Indicate why the proposed facility is needed.

Most of the area served is rural, rugged and mountainous. The geographic challenges of the district create operational issues with emergency radio communications. Current older technology radios have difficulty with signal reception, which inhibits our incoming and outgoing radio transmissions. The requested radios meet new standardization specifications and will allow for us to have interoperability capabilities with CalFire and other fire services partner agencies. Good on scene communications helps to mitigate incidents faster by communicating and leveraging the appropriate resources needed on the event. The investment in updated communication technology would increase our ability to serve the rural community and also would increase firefighter safety.

4. Service Area. Indicate what area the proposed facility will serve and, if known, the population or number of families served.

The Sonoma County Fire District- Station 9 covers approximately 20 square miles and serves the populations of Guerneville, Rio Nido, Oddfellows Park, Vacation Beach, Guernewood Park and the Armstrong Valley. The population is estimated at 4500, and the demographic information available for Guerneville, CA indicates that 42% of the population are over 55 years old, and 12% are age 19 or under.

APPLICANT'S FEASIBILITY REPORT

1. Existing Facility. Briefly describe what facilities you currently have or how service is currently provided.

Sonoma County Fire District Station #6 serves a rural mountain community with the next closest fire station being miles away. This community was the first point of impact during the devastating 2017 Tubbs wildfire and found itself impacted again by the 2019 Kincaide Wildfire and the 2020 Glass Wildfire. This station is the first response to vehicle accidents on heavily traveled roadways. The Calistoga/Petrified Forest Road and the Mark West Springs/Porter Creek Road serve as main thoroughfares between Sonoma, Napa, and Lake counties. The cross of these busy two-lane country roads lies in the heart of the immediate response zone. Emergency responses to vehicle accidents are common due to the rural windy roads, black ice, frequent stormy conditions and occasionally snow. Incidents where a fallen tree blocks the roadways have increased during winter storms and heavy wind events since the Tubbs, Kincade and Glass wildfires burned and devastated large portions of the response area.

2. Proposed Facility. Describe what you want to purchase or construct. Indicate what the facility will be used for, approximate size, and expected method of procurement. For buildings indicate location, basic materials or type of construction, and attach a sketch or working drawings. For items of major equipment, indicate new or used, existing or custom-built, and any special features.

The proposal is to enhance emergency response capabilities to the rural community served by Sonoma County Fire District- Station 6 through the addition of one full set of auto extrication tools (Jaws of Life), ten (10) on-scene lighting devices, five (5) new chain saws and two (2) smoke blowers.

3. Need for the Facility. Indicate why the proposed facility is needed.

Fatal vehicle accidents have happened too often in our response area. The station does not currently have a full set of extrication equipment (Jaws of Life). Having a complete set of equipment would provide the ability to extricate a patient quicker, thus improving patient outcomes. Scene lighting properly positioned on accident scenes can help to avoid additional secondary accidents and improves firefighter safety on scene. Having new chainsaws will allow for the downed trees to be quickly cleared and help to avoid accidents. The current chainsaws are hammy-down units from previous agencies and have been used beyond their useful life. Smoke blowers help to remove smoke quickly from structure fires, which puts the fire engine into service faster to help the community.

4. Service Area. Indicate what area the proposed facility will serve and, if known, the population or number of families served.

The Sonoma County Fire District- Station 6 covers approximately 122 square miles. Many of the residents are elderly and have fixed incomes. This area was significantly damaged by three federally declared wilfire disasters, and is still in the post-disaster recovery stage.

Between the

The Board of Administration, California Public Employees' Retirement System, hereinafter referred to as Board, and the governing body of the above public agency, hereinafter referred to as Public Agency, having entered into a contract effective October 1, 1990, and witnessed September 19, 1990, and as amended effective September 1, 1995, January 1, 2008, August 1, 2019, March 1, 2021, and October 1, 2021, which provides for participation of Public Agency in said System, Board and Public Agency hereby agree as follows:

- A. Paragraphs 1 through 19 are hereby stricken from said contract as executed effective October 1, 2021, and hereby replaced by the following paragraphs numbered 1 through 20 inclusive:
 - 1. All words and terms used herein which are defined in the Public Employees' Retirement Law shall have the meaning as defined therein unless otherwise specifically provided. "Normal retirement age" shall mean age 55 for classic local miscellaneous members, age 62 for new local miscellaneous members, age 55 for classic local safety members and age 57 for new local safety members.

- Public Agency shall participate in the Public Employees' Retirement System from and after October 1, 1990, making its employees as hereinafter provided, members of said System subject to all provisions of the Public Employees' Retirement Law except such as apply only on election of a contracting agency and are not provided for herein and to all amendments to said Law hereafter enacted except those, which by express provisions thereof, apply only on the election of a contracting agency.
- 3. Public Agency agrees to indemnify, defend and hold harmless the California Public Employees' Retirement System (CalPERS) and its trustees, agents and employees, the CalPERS Board of Administration, and the California Public Employees' Retirement Fund from any claims, demands, actions, losses, liabilities, damages, judgments, expenses and costs, including but not limited to interest, penalties and attorney fees that may arise as a result of any of the following:
 - (a) Public Agency's election to provide retirement benefits, provisions or formulas under this Contract that are different than the retirement benefits, provisions or formulas provided under the Public Agency's prior non-CalPERS retirement program.
 - (b) Any dispute, disagreement, claim, or proceeding (including without limitation arbitration, administrative hearing, or litigation) between Public Agency and its employees (or their representatives) which relates to Public Agency's election to amend this Contract to provide retirement benefits, provisions or formulas that are different than such employees' existing retirement benefits, provisions or formulas.
 - (c) Public Agency's agreement with a third party other than CalPERS to provide retirement benefits, provisions, or formulas that are different than the retirement benefits, provisions or formulas provided under this Contract and provided for under the California Public Employees' Retirement Law.
- 4. Employees of Public Agency in the following classes shall become members of said Retirement System except such in each such class as are excluded by law or this agreement:
 - a. Local Fire Fighters (herein referred to as local safety members);
 - b. Employees other than local safety members (herein referred to as local miscellaneous members).

5. In addition to the classes of employees excluded from membership by said Retirement Law, the following classes of employees shall not become members of said Retirement System:

a. ELECTED OFFICIALS; AND

b. POLICE OFFICERS.

- 6. This contract shall be a continuation of the contract of the Bennett Valley Fire Protection District and Rincon Valley Fire Protection District, hereinafter referred to as "Former Agency". The accumulated contributions, assets and liability for prior and current service under the Former Agency's contract shall be merged pursuant to Section 20508 of the Government Code. Such merger occurred April 4, 2019.
- 7. This contract shall be a continuation of the contract of the Russian River Fire Protection District, hereinafter referred to as "Former Agency". The accumulated contributions, assets and liability for prior and current service under the Former Agency's contract shall be merged pursuant to Section 20508 of the Government Code. Such merger occurred June 15, 2020.
- 8. This contract shall be a continuation of the contract of the Forestville Fire Protection District, hereinafter referred to as "Former Agency". The accumulated contributions, assets and liability for prior and current service under the Former Agency's contract shall be merged pursuant to Section 20508 of the Government Code. Such merger occurred July 1, 2021.
- 9. This contract shall be a continuation of the contract of the Bodega Bay Fire Protection District, hereinafter referred to as "Former Agency". The accumulated contributions, assets and liability for prior and current service under the Former Agency's contract shall be merged pursuant to Section 20508 of the Government Code. Such merger occurred July 1, 2022.
- 10. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a classic local miscellaneous member in employment before and not on or after January 1, 2008, shall be determined in accordance with Section 21353 of said Retirement Law (2% at age 60 Full)
- 11. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a classic local miscellaneous member in employment on or after January 1, 2008, shall be determined in accordance with Section 21354.5 of said Retirement Law (2.7% at age 55 Full).
- 12. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a new local miscellaneous member shall be determined in accordance with Section 7522.20 of said Retirement Law (2% at age 62 Full).

- 13. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a classic local safety member shall be determined in accordance with Section 21363.1 of said Retirement Law (3% at age 55 Full).
- 14. The percentage of final compensation to be provided for each year of credited prior and current service as a new local safety member shall be determined in accordance with Section 7522.25(d) of said Retirement Law (2.7% at age 57 Full).
- 15. Public Agency elected and elects to be subject to the following optional provisions:
 - a. Section 20042 (One-Year Final Compensation) for classic local safety members only.
 - b. Section 20938 (Limit Prior Service to Members Employed on Contract Date).
 - c. Section 20965 (Credit for Unused Sick Leave) for local safety members only.
 - d. Section 21574 (Fourth Level of 1959 Survivor Benefits).
- 16. Public Agency, in accordance with Government Code Section 20834, shall not be considered an "employer" for purposes of the Public Employees' Retirement Law. Contributions of the Public Agency shall be fixed and determined as provided in Government Code Section 20834, and such contributions hereafter made shall be held by the Board as provided in Government Code Section 20834.
- 17. Public Agency shall contribute to said Retirement System the contributions determined by actuarial valuations of prior and future service liability with respect to local miscellaneous members and local safety members of said Retirement System.
- 18. Public Agency shall also contribute to said Retirement System as follows:
 - a. Contributions required per covered member on account of the 1959 Survivor Benefits provided under Section 21574 of said Retirement Law. (Subject to annual change.) In addition, all assets and liabilities of Public Agency and its employees shall be pooled in a single account, based on term insurance rates, for survivors of all local miscellaneous members and local safety members.

- b. A reasonable amount, as fixed by the Board, payable in one installment within 60 days of date of contract to cover the costs of administering said System as it affects the employees of Public Agency, not including the costs of special valuations or of the periodic investigation and valuations required by law.
- c. A reasonable amount, as fixed by the Board, payable in one installment as the occasions arise, to cover the costs of special valuations on account of employees of Public Agency, and costs of the periodic investigation and valuations required by law.
- 19. Contributions required of Public Agency and its employees shall be subject to adjustment by Board on account of amendments to the Public Employees' Retirement Law, and on account of the experience under the Retirement System as determined by the periodic investigation and valuation required by said Retirement Law.
- 20. Contributions required of Public Agency and its employees shall be paid by Public Agency to the Retirement System within fifteen days after the end of the period to which said contributions refer or as may be prescribed by Board regulation. If more or less than the correct amount of contributions is paid for any period, proper adjustment shall be made in connection with subsequent remittances. Adjustments on account of errors in contributions required of any employee may be made by direct payments between the employee and the Board.

BACKGROUND: 66006(b)(1)(A)

State law requires any local agency that imposes development impact fees to prepare an annual report providing specific information about those fees. Therefore, in accordance with the provisions of the California Government Code Section 66006 (b) and 66001 (d), as amended by Assembly Bill (AB) 518 and Senate Bill (SB) 1693, I hereby submit the Development Impact Fee (DIF) Report for Sonoma County Fire District, California for the fiscal year (FY) ended June 30, 2022.

DIFs are charged by local governmental agencies in connection with approval of development projects. The purpose of these fees is to defray all or a portion of the cost of public facilities related to the development project. The legal requirements for enactment of a DIF program are set forth in Government Code §§ 66000- 66025 (the "Mitigation Fee Act"), the bulk of which was adopted as 1987's AB 1600 and thus commonly referred to as "AB 1600 requirements".

For Sonoma County Fire District, DIFs are collected by the County of Sonoma on behalf of the District for the purpose of mitigating the impacts caused by new development on the Districts infrastructure. Fees are used to finance the acquisition, construction and improvement of public facilities needed as a result of this new development. A separate fund (111) has been established to account for the impact of new development.

Fees imposed on new development within the Sonoma County Fire District within Sonoma County have been in place since July 1, 2021. In 2021, the District contracted with SCI Consulting Group in which they conducted a Fire Impact Fee Nexus Study that detailed the impacts of future growth on local facilities. This report provided the analysis and support for the DIFs imposed by the Sonoma County Fire District. This study was adopted by the Sonoma County Fire District's Board of Directors by resolution on October 20,2020 and the Board of Directors confirmed administrative corrections to the fire impact nexus study by resolution on February 16, 2021. An agreement for services dated March 23, 2021, was entered between the County of Sonoma, a political subdivision of the State of California, and Sonoma County Fire District to establish and administer development impact fees for fire protection services.



State law requires the District prepare and make available to the public the DIF Report within 180 days after the last day of each fiscal year. The County Council must review the annual report at a regularly scheduled public meeting not less than fifteen days after the information is made available to the public. This report was filed with the County Administrator's Office and available for public review on October 25, 2022.

BACKGROUND: 66006(b)(1)(A)

State law requires any local agency that imposes development impact fees to prepare an annual report providing specific information about those fees. Therefore, in accordance with the provisions of the California Government Code Section 66006 (b) and 66001 (d), as amended by Assembly Bill (AB) 518 and Senate Bill (SB) 1693, I hereby submit the Development Impact Fee (DIF) Report for Sonoma County Fire District, California for the fiscal year (FY) ended June 30, 2022.

DIFs are charged by local governmental agencies in connection with approval of development projects. The purpose of these fees is to defray all or a portion of the cost of public facilities related to the development project. The legal requirements for enactment of a DIF program are set forth in Government Code §§ 66000- 66025 (the "Mitigation Fee Act"), the bulk of which was adopted as 1987's AB 1600 and thus commonly referred to as "AB 1600 requirements".

For the Town of Windsor, DIFs are collected by the Town on behalf of the Fire District for the purpose of mitigating the impacts caused by new development on the Fire Districts infrastructure. Fees are used to finance the acquisition, construction and improvement of public facilities needed as a result of this new development. A separate fund (241) has been established within the Town's financial system to account for the impact of new development.

Fees imposed on new development within the Sonoma County Fire District within the Town of Windsor have been in place since November 1, 2021. In 2021, the district contracted with SCI Consulting Group in which they conducted a Fire Impact Fee Nexus Study that detailed the impacts of future growth on local facilities. This report provided the analysis and support for the DIFs imposed by the Sonoma County Fire District. This study was adopted by the Sonoma County Fire District's Board of Directors by resolution on October 20,2020 and the Board of Directors confirmed administrative corrections to the fire impact nexus study by resolution on February 16, 2021. The Town Council adopted the new fire impact fees by Resolution No 3696-21 on September 1, 2021.

Topic: Authorize the Purchase of one fully equipped Ambulance (\$410,487) and one Water Tender (\$525,000)

Recommendation:

Staff Recommends that the Board authorize the purchase of One (1) fully equipped ambulance not to exceed \$410,487 and One (1) Water Tender not to exceed \$525,000.

Financial Impact:

The fully equipped ambulance project is expected to be a cost of \$410,487. Staff was able to leverage U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) Community Facilities Grant Funding in the amount of \$200,000 for this project. The District match will be \$210,487. This project is included in the 2022-2023 Fiscal Year approved budget.

The water tender project has an anticipated cost of \$525,000. Staff was able to leverage an additional USDA Community Facilities Grant in the amount of \$183,753 for this project. The District match will be \$341,250. This project was included in the 2022-2023 Fiscal Year approved budget at a cost of \$500,000. Staff will include the additional \$25,000 budget approval (if needed) in a midyear budget adjustment.

Background:

The Fire District has a need for a new ambulance and a new water tender to replace outdated apparatus. The Board approved the finances for both projects as part of the budget adoption process.

Board level approval of the purchases is required per the district procurement policy. If approved, staff will move forward with the procurement of the two-apparatus following the District's procurement policies, and the USDA grant guidelines.

Topic:

Change the Fire Inspector Position

Recommendation:

Modify existing Fire Inspector position to be represented by IAFF L1401 under the agreement dated July 1, 2021 - June 30, 2023 and change CalPERS Non-Safety to CalPERS Safety pending CalPERS approval.

Financial Impact:

The maximum financial impact to the Fire District under the current L1401 MOU at the top step is approximately \$11,000 / year.

Background:

July 2020, we hired Fire Inspector Osborne to the Prevention Division. The position was initially created as a non-Safety position under the Public Employee Retirement System ("PERS"). The goal was to get additional staff into the Division and out in the field to support the rapidly developing needs of the rapidly expanding Fire District. To date this position has conducted well over 100 fire investigations. This position is supervised by Deputy Fire Marshal Piloni, a Safety position and shares the same investigation responsibilities and duties as the non-Safety Fire Inspector position.

In recent years, research regarding Fire Investigators health and safety, and the resulting practice changes, has not kept pace with that of Firefighters. While some information can be brought from the Firefighter environment to that of the Fire Investigator, some cannot, specifically related to post fire environments. In addition to all the physical and environmental hazards that can be present at fire scenes, Fire Investigators also need to be aware of the biologic and toxic hazards that may be present at fire scenes they are working in. Toxic hazards are present at every fire scene (forest, brush, crop, structure, vehicle, trash). While fires are typically short-duration events, the chronic exposure effects can have a long-term health impact on those involved. Fire debris also contains many different chemicals, gases, and particulates that are hazardous.

Our Fire Investigators are subject to some, if not all, of the environmental hazards that our Firefighters experience. Therefore, it is Staff's recommendation that we modify the position to Safety to ensure our Fire Inspector has the same protections and retirement benefits through PERS that our Deputy Fire Marshal and line Firefighters have.
